



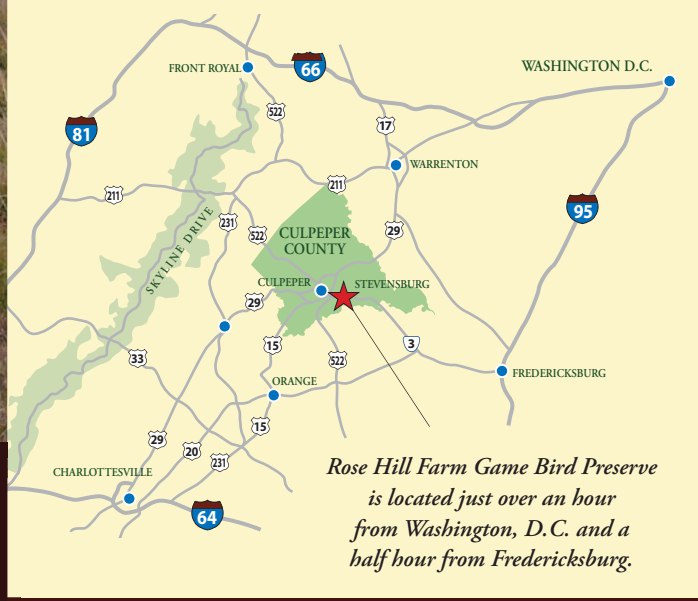
TOWER SHOOTS

Rose Hill Game Bird Preserve offers tower shoots with strong flying pheasants managed by a hunt master in the European style. Hunting in the company of friends amid scenic views and natural surroundings will be an unforgettable experience.

Private tower shoots are available. We will tailor the event to meet the individual needs of you and your party. Prices of tower shoots begin at \$250 but may vary with special requests and numbers of released birds in privately scheduled events.

UPLAND GAME BIRD HUNTS

Quail, partridge, and ringneck pheasants hunted in natural wild habitat over well-trained pointing and retrieving dogs. Nothing is more exciting than the sudden flush of a fast-flying game bird.



DIRECTIONS

From Washington, D.C. (Drive time just over an hour):
From 495 take I-66 West and drive 22 miles to exit for Route 29 South. Drive 34 miles and take Route 3 East. Drive 5 miles then turn right on Batna Road and go 100 yards to Rose Hill Farm Game Bird Preserve on your right.

From Charlottesville (Drive time 45 minutes): Take 29 North and drive 43 miles then turn right onto Route 3 East. Drive 5 miles to a right on Batna Road. Go 100 yards to Rose Hill Farm Game Preserve on your right.

From Fredericksburg (Drive time about half an hour):
From I-95 take Route 3 West for 28 miles. Turn left on Batna Road then go 100 yards to Rose Hill Farm Game Preserve on your right.

In the heart of Virginia's Piedmont region lies historic Rose Hill Farm Game Bird Preserve, a 210-acre estate where sportsmen have hunted since Virginia was still a colony. During the Civil War, when Culpeper County was the site of the largest cavalry battle ever fought in the Western Hemisphere, Rose Hill was the headquarters of Union General Judson Kilpatrick. His soldiers pitched tents in the game-rich fields surrounding the mansion.

Today hunters enjoy prime upland game bird hunts at Rose Hill just over an hour from Washington, D.C. with the majestic Blue Ridge Mountains lining the horizon. The property boasts a variety of managed cover and natural grassland, providing a unique, varied hunting experience.

Virginia law requires all hunters to have a Virginia Hunting License or a Non-Resident Shooting Preserve Hunting License in their possession when hunting. All hunters must wear an article of Blaze Orange, such as a hat or vest. Eye and ear protection are recommended. Hunting season runs September 1 to April 30. All hunters must sign a waiver prior to hunt.
